- Designed for medical providers who care for patients with neurological and neurosurgical emergencies, acute stroke and brain hemorrhage, acute brain injury, coma and disorders that require hospital, emergency department, and intensive care unit evaluation and management

- Pharmacotherapy workshops and ICU EEG workshops will utilize audience participation in on screen quizzes and share protocols regarding osmotherapy for raised intracranial pressure and antiepileptic drug therapy

TARGET AUDIENCE

This course is designed for medical providers in neuro ICU, ICU, emergency medicine, neurology, neurosurgery and intensivists from pulmonary, anesthesia and neuro intensive care backgrounds as well as ARNPs, PAs, paramedics, EMS medical personnel and allied health providers including physical, occupational and speech therapists who care for patients with neurological emergencies.
