Poster Abstracts

Overview: After the final presentation of the first day of the Summit, attendees will adjourn to the Dan Abraham Healthy Living Center. There they can tour the new Sports Medicine Center and attend the Poster Session. Attendees will enjoy the academic posters, beverages and reception fare. The relaxed setting will stimulate dialogue among the conference presenters, the attendees and the faculty.

The posters will showcase each participant's work, all of which will share the theme of being applicable to concussion. Posters can feature data-driven original research on any aspect of concussion: education, prevention, diagnosis, consequences and treatment. The concussion posters may pertain to: (i) epidemiology of concussion in contact/collision sports such as hockey, (ii) prevention programs such as neck strengthening and muscle activation/recruitment; use of rule changes and their impact; and or behavioral modification programs such as Fair Play; (iii) diagnostic developments such as objective versus subjective methods, (iv) the science of concussions and post-concussion pathophysiology, and (v) basic science, testing interventions and potential treatment.

Every effort will be made to include as many posters as possible, based on available space.

Poster Size: The finished poster size should be 4'x6' or 4'x8' to fit on the provided display space.

Abstract Eligibility: In support of inclusiveness, abstracts are not limited to first-time presentations. Abstracts that have been presented at previous meetings are eligible for consideration, as are abstracts from papers that have already been published.

Number of Entries: A participant may be the primary author on no more than two abstracts; however, he or she may be a contributing author on any number of abstracts.

Submission: The deadline for submission is **Friday, August 18**. Please submit abstracts to [Dave Krause, P.T., D.Sc., OCS](#). Each submission must include: An abstract (300-500 Words – Title - Background/purpose – Methods – Results – Conclusions/Clinical Relevance) institution, medical specialty, address, and contact information.

Notification of Results: Authors will be notified of acceptance by **Friday, September 8**.

Poster Presentation: All course attendees will be invited to the reception and poster session. Approved presenters are expected to be at the reception and poster session Thursday, September 28th, 2017 from 5:30 - 7:30 pm.
