# Center for Clinical and Translational Science on Shared Decision Making for Cardiovascular Risk Reduction – Online CME Course

# **Activity Description**

Course Description – This course will review challenges in matching treatment recommendations for cardiovascular risk reduction to patient need and context. It will describe shared decision making as a method for overcoming these challenges and introduce a new, EHR-embedded tool for facilitating these conversations.

## **Target Audience**

This course is appropriate for Primary care (family medicine, internal medicine) clinicians (physicians, nurse practitioners, physician assistants).

## **Learning Objectives**

Upon conclusion of this activity, participants should be able to:

- Describe the risk-treatment paradox in cardiovascular risk reduction
- Describe how shared decision-making approaches may better target treatment to the needs and contexts of diverse patients
- Describe and effectively use a new electronic decision aid for cardiovascular risk reduction that automatically calculates individual risk

# **Program Schedule**

First, watch *Use of Shared Decision Making to Individualize CV Prevention Strategies,* this 25.25 minute video from Dr. Victor Montori. It provides a background on the science and principles of shared decision making, including descriptions of the evidence supporting shared decision-making tools and interventions.

Second, watch *Heart Health – Shared Decision Making Tool Re: CV Prevention*, this 6.16 minute video demonstrating the capabilities of the Cardiovascular Prevention Choice Decision Aid. This tool is currently available from within your EHR, where it is programmed to auto-populate patient variables.
