

Nurse Practitioner and Physician Assistant Preceptor Course

Activity Description

The course was developed in response to a NP/PA preceptor needs assessment conducted in early 2017. A preceptor needs assessment survey was disseminated electronically to 1,296 NP and PA providers at Mayo Midwest practice sites. The survey was conducted within an academic-practice partnership and contained questions related to preceptor motivation, experience, expectations, preparation, training, resource awareness and barriers to serving as a preceptor. Respondents preferred a blended format for preceptor education and training (52%). Preceptor themes included: Time management & efficiency, assessment & evaluation, communication & feedback, goal setting & coaching and adult teaching/learning principles. Preceptor barriers included: lack of experience, lack of support, time, preparation, productivity pressures, and unclear expectations. The learning modules included in the course provide education to address the learning needs identified. There is a required post-course quiz with an 80% pass rate in order to claim credit, with 1 retake allowed.

Target Audience

This activity is appropriate for physicians, nurse practitioners, and physician assistants interested in serving as clinical preceptors.

Learning Objectives

- Utilize structured communication techniques to deliver NP and PA student feedback on performance
- Explain the process needed for preceptor documentation of NP and PA students in the electronic medical record
- Describe methods to improve time management and efficiency when precepting students in a busy clinical practice
- Review the legal and ethical considerations of precepting students
