Our virtual Symposium schedule departs from the traditional schedule of an in-person conference and is designed to maximize flexibility and avoid Zoom fatigue for participants. We have shortened the length of the days to better accommodate attendees in different time zones, and we have chosen to offer clusters of sessions over a period of 3 weeks. Registrants are encouraged to attend as many sessions as their schedule allows with the assurance that:

- All conference sessions are included in the registration fee
- No pre-registration is necessary for workshops and performances
- Recordings of plenary presentations will be available through October 9, 2022

**Workshops**

Presented by 2 to 4 facilitators representing a range of disciplines and institutions, workshops will engage participants in an applied practice of health-related humanities with a focus on techniques and skills. 90 minutes.

**Panel**

Designed to examine a central issue or question, 3 to 4 presenters will offer brief, diverse perspectives of 15-20 minutes, followed by 15 minutes for discussion. 75 minutes.

**Performance**

Collaborative original works of music, spoken word, theatre, dance or any other performance based artistic medium will be presented by a minimum of 2 artists. 75 minutes.

**Reverse Paper**

In this format, groups will have 10 minutes to present a brief description of a new, original work-in-progress, idea or a paper with a central research question, followed by 10 minutes to invite creative, spontaneous ideation. Content will not have been previously published or presented. 20 min. each.
