Course Objectives:

- Discuss new surgical strategies for chronic dysphagia refractory to therapy.
- Discuss holistic approaches in rehabilitation of patients not responding to traditional voice therapy.
- Explain surgical approaches for complex airway reconstruction cases.
- Describe manual therapy approaches for chronic muscle tension dysphonia and dysphagia.
- Describe techniques for respiratory training to improve swallowing and voice.
- Identify surgical and non-surgical treatment modalities for head and neck cancer.

WORKSHOP OBJECTIVES

Advanced Laryngectomy Rehabilitation: Hands-on TEP Management

- Assess patient and perform fitting of a tracheoesophageal voice prostheses in a laryngectomee.
- Determine the proper heat and moisture exchange system for laryngectomees and instruct the patient on placement and management.

Manual Therapy Techniques for Muscle Tension Dysphonia

- Identify paralaryngeal muscles affecting vocal function.
- Perform basic circumlaryngeal massage.
- Use tactile awareness with paralaryngeal landmarks for digital manipulation.
- Explain basic therapy techniques for alleviation of muscle tension dysphonia.

Office-Based Laryngology Procedures: Hands-on Lab

- Identify methods and tools used to perform office-based procedures.
- Evaluate when to use of an office-based procedure vs. surgery.
- Perform office-based vocal fold injections, transnasal esophagoscopy, balloon dilation, and KTP laser ablation on mannequins.

Advanced Techniques: Manual Lymphatic Drainage with Compression

- Identify presence of lymphedema in head and neck.
- Explain techniques of manual lymphatic drainage and the use of compression garments.
