General Information

COURSE DESCRIPTION AND LEARNING OBJECTIVES

As the field of hospital medicine continues to grow, so does the complexity and management of hospitalized patients. This program will address many of the challenges experienced by hospital-based health care professionals and provide a forum for the exchange of clinical and practice ideas to enhance the delivery of health care and provide better patient outcomes. Using an interactive, case-based format, key highlights from most major areas of internal medicine and its subspecialties will be presented.

To maximize your time away from your practice and enhance your learning experience, three optional educational activities will be offered: (1) Point-of-Care Ultrasound Workshop; (2) Ultrasound-Guided Procedures Workshop; and (3) the American Board of Internal Medicine Maintenance of Certification session on 2014 Update in Hospital Medicine. Upon completion of this course, participants should be able to:

- List the initial steps in management of the hospitalized patient with bleeding complications who is on a novel oral anticoagulant.
- Determine the appropriate tests for evaluating syncope in the hospital.
- Cite the appropriate indications for blood cell transfusion in patients with upper gastrointestinal bleeding (UGIB).
- Manage an exacerbation of chronic obstructive pulmonary disease.
- Differentiate the most common types of transfusion reactions and recognize their management.
- Apply a cost-effective strategy to manage pneumonia in the hospital.
- Develop an approach to breaking bad news to a hospitalized patient.
- Classify the severity of aortic stenosis.
- Construct an effective medication plan for the treatment of acute pain.
- Evaluate thrombocytopenia in a hospitalized patient.

INTENDED AUDIENCE

This program is designed for inpatient care providers including physicians, nurse practitioners and physician assistants. Hospitalists are defined as those who spend most of their professional practice caring for hospitalized patients. Internal Medicine and Family Practice, among others, are specialties that have practitioners who care for hospitalized patients.

POINT-OF-CARE ULTRASOUND WORKSHOP

WORKSHOP DESCRIPTION AND LEARNING OBJECTIVES

This introductory workshop is designed for clinicians interested in exploring the use of point-of-care diagnostic ultrasound and performing ultrasound examinations on live models with bedside instruction. This workshop will emphasize focused cardiac ultrasound, assessing global contractility and presence of pericardial effusions. An integral part of the echocardiogram will be visualization of the inferior vena cava as a means of estimating central venous pressure.

Participants also will have an opportunity to perform abdominal ultrasound (FAST), thoracic ultrasound (rule out pneumothorax) and lumbar spine (to assist LP). Participants interested in utilizing ultrasound as an adjunct to performing procedures will have an opportunity to scan the internal jugular vein, and peripheral veins (brachial, femoral, popliteal, etc.).

Upon completion of this session, participants should be able to:

- Visualize the heart in at least two different windows and assess global contractility.
- Identify the pericardium and describe the appearance of a pericardial effusion.
- Visualize the inferior vena cava and estimate central venous pressure based on measurement of the diameter and collapsibility.
- Visualize the internal jugular vein and demonstrate how to distinguish the IJ from the carotid artery.
- Visualize and recognize normal anatomy and physiology of pleura and underlined lungs.

WORKSHOP DESCRIPTION AND LEARNING OBJECTIVES

The use of ultrasound to verify and access a target is considered a standard of care for most common bedside procedures. This has been shown to increase success and safety and decrease complications. This workshop has been designed to introduce clinicians to the concept of ultrasound use for central line placement, thoracentesis, paracentesis, and lumbar puncture.

The workshop will begin with an introduction to pertinent technical aspects of ultrasound image acquisition and individual procedures (common indications, contraindications, equipment, fluid studies, pitfalls and troubleshooting). With assistance by bedside instructors, participants will then have an opportunity to scan live models and practice procedures on mannequins.

Optional Educational Activities

Upon completion of this session, participants should be able to:

- Visualize the internal jugular vein and differentiate from the carotid artery.
- Recognize and locate a fluid collection in the chest and abdominal cavities.
- Introduce a needle under direct ultrasound guidance into the desired target.
- Visualize and recognize perispinal/spinal structures and mark appropriate target for lumbar puncture.
