

How We Rise Poster Session FAQ

GRIT for Women in Medicine: Growth, Resilience, Inspiration, & Tenacity 2020 (GRIT)

Q: Do you have to be affiliated with Mayo Clinic to submit a poster abstract?

A: No, you do not need to be affiliated with Mayo Clinic to submit a poster abstract.

Q: Do you have to register for GRIT to *submit* a poster abstract?

A: No, you do not need to be registered in order to submit a poster abstract.

Q: Do you have to register to *present* the poster?

A: Yes, if your poster is accepted, you are required to register for the course.

Q: Do poster presenters get any expenses paid for by GRIT?

A: GRIT is unable to pay for your conference expenses.

Q: How are posters selected for presentation?

A: To have your poster considered for inclusion in the poster session, you will need to complete and submit the abstract form on the GRIT website describing the key points that will be displayed in your poster. Poster abstracts will be reviewed weekly by physicians and administrators on the GRIT Planning Committee. Communication back to the authors will be approximately two (2) weeks after submission.

Q: How many posters are selected for the poster presentation?

A: Generally, between 40 and 60 posters.

Q: Can a poster be presented if it has already been presented/published elsewhere?

A: Presenting in our poster session does not prohibit publishing the same information elsewhere (either before or after our session). However, to be selected, the poster needs to meet the criteria for our audience. If your work is being considered for publication elsewhere, please be sure that their rules do not prohibit you from presenting it at the poster session.

Q: Are there any other requirements?

A: The only other requirements are those laid out in the submission instructions.

Q: Who will view the poster session?

A: Posters will be viewed by registered attendees at GRIT. This is a unique opportunity for authors to highlight initiatives (clinical, education, research, administrative) for enhancement of professional fulfillment and advancement of women to leadership roles in medicine.

Q: How much exposure will the posters have to Conference attendees?

A: Posters will be set-up in the exhibit hall and will be on display Thursday, 6:30 a.m. – 4:45 p.m. Friday, 6:30 a.m. – 12:00 p.m. and Saturday, 6:30 a.m. – 9:45 a.m. Authors are expected to be with their posters during the four (4) assigned poster session(s). See Program for specific times.

Q: Is there media presence at the poster session?

A: No.

Q: Is there a photographer?

A: A professional photographer is not available. Course staff may take pictures of the poster sessions using a personal device for course purpose.
