


Charles H. Mayo-Integration Award

Dr. Charles Mayo implemented dentistry as a subspecialty of his medical practice over 100 years ago, stating, “The practice of medicine includes dentistry and dentistry is the practice of a special branch of medicine...” This integration of dentistry with medicine coalesced into an interdisciplinary approach to oral care that has become a hallmark of treatment at Mayo Clinic. Integration is the act of combining parts to make a whole, but when completed this whole is in fact greater than the sum of its parts. This award celebrates integration in all forms, as we know it can come in many shapes and sizes.



Joseph A. Gibilisco-Innovation Award

Dr. Gibilisco served as Chair from 1962-1976, and throughout his tenure at Mayo Clinic increased Dental Specialties presence in the practice. With a mind for innovation, he also founded the Dental Reviews program. This award places a spotlight on innovation. Whatever the term you choose to use--revolution, invention, transformation, renewal--at its heart innovation strives to use our current knowledge and understanding to continually expand and improve.



Phillip J. Sheridan-Mayo Values Award

The Mayo Clinic Values include: Respect, Integrity, Compassion, Healing, Teamwork, Innovation, Excellence, and Stewardship; otherwise known as RICH TIES. Beginning his Mayo career in 1967, Dr. Sheridan has been committed to upholding Mayo Values ever since. He served as Chair from 1985-1998 and Periodontics Program Director from 1999-2006. His patient care and department presence was a consistent shining example of Mayo Values throughout his career, with an exceptional illustration of these values occurring in during an acute period of need in the Department. Despite having retired, Dr. Sheridan readily returned to Mayo to again support the Periodontal Program and it's residents. This award celebrates these RICH TIES in all forms, and places a spotlight on the values that support our primary mission- the needs of the patient come first.



Boyd S. Gardner-Pioneer Award

Leading the way, Dr. Gardner was the first dentist and oral surgeon at Mayo Clinic. He was the first Chair of Dental Surgery and the first to use nitrous oxide inhalation sedation at Mayo Clinic. This award recognizes projects and ideas that are boldly “leading the way” and daring to take the first steps into uncharted territory.


