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

Who We Are

Southeastern Minnesota Area Agency on Aging is a private non-profit, 501(c)(3) agency serving the eleven counties of Dodge, Fillmore, Freeborn, Goodhue, Houston, Mower, Olmsted, Rice, Steele, Wabasha and Winona.

Designated by the Minnesota Board on Aging in 1976 to administer Older Americans Act funds, Minnesota's area agencies on aging works with families, older adults, service providers and public agencies to help support, coordinate or develop community services.

A volunteer board of directors, half of whom are over age 60, governs the agency and meets monthly.

Our Work

Senior LinkAge® Line

The Senior LinkAge Line is a free, statewide service of the Minnesota Board on Aging in partnership with Southeastern Minnesota Area Agency on Aging. The Senior LinkAge Line helps older Minnesotans and caregivers find answers and connect to the services and support they need.

Health Insurance Counseling

As part of our Senior LinkAge Line work, staff and volunteers provide information and help with Medicare, supplements, prescription drug programs, Medicare Savings programs and long term care insurance.



Local partners lead healthy living, evidence based programs with Older Americans Act funds.
