

#### **Course Description**

Selected Topics in Internal Medicine is a postgraduate course designed to update general internists, internist-subspecialists, family medicine specialists, and other primary health care providers on selected internal medicine topics. Some of the most common problems encountered in clinical practice will be represented. The focus will be on clinical pearls and practice updates. Presentations will be made by experts from various disciplines in internal medicine.

- Summarize recent updates, clinical studies, and new guidelines that impact practice in general medicine.
- Describe the indications and major adverse effects of newly FDA approved medications that are applicable to a general medicine practice.
