Course Description

The Approaches to Pediatric Depression and Related Disorders will focus on presenting an update on developments in the diagnosis, assessment and treatment of pediatric mood disorders and related conditions. Specific areas of focus will include unipolar depression, bipolar disorder, suicidal behavior, bullying, substance abuse and trauma. Course faculty will emphasize an evidence-based approach to management highlighting cutting edge research from structured psychotherapeutic approaches, psychopharmacology, neuroimaging, and emerging therapeutics in children and adolescents. The course will include video vignettes to guide interactive, highly focused didactic sessions. Leading content experts will facilitate challenging case discussions generated by participants or course faculty.

Course Learning Objectives

Upon conclusion of this program, participants should be able to:

- Identify correct diagnosis of depression and bipolar disorder in children and adolescents
- Discuss comorbidities, including trauma, eating disorders, psychosocial stress, Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD), chronic pain and chronic medication conditions
- Articulate a comprehensive treatment plan for depressed children and adolescents with complex presentations

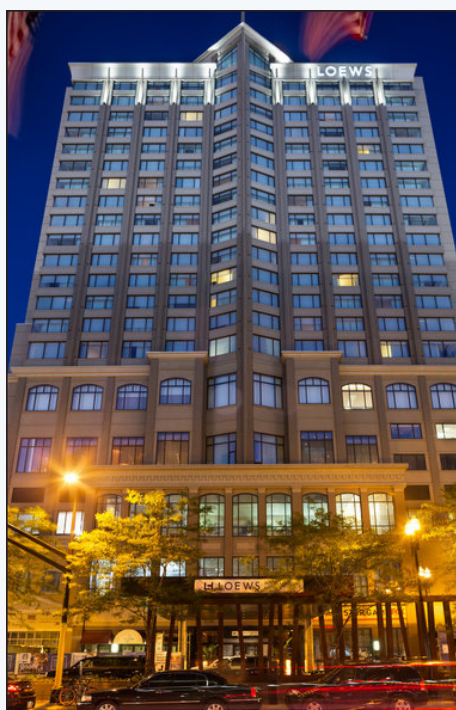

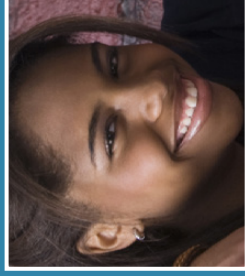
