Connecting with Patients for Tobacco Free Living Online Course

Connecting with Patients for Tobacco Free Living is a four module 4 hour online learning experience using video, case based learning and interactive responses, to prepare health care providers to motivate, treat, and support patients in becoming tobacco free. Tobacco use disorder is one of the leading causes of preventable death worldwide. Treatment consists of counseling for behavior change

- Identify the best practice for behavioral and pharmacologic treatment.
- Identify effective messaging to prevent relapse.
