Mayo Clinic and Neurocritical Care Society Emergency Neurological Life Support (ENLS) This course provides attendees with an overview of 14 neurological emergencies, including acute ischemic stroke, intracerebral hemorrhage, subarachnoid hemorrhage, meningitis/ encephalitis, coma after cardiac arrest and spinal cord injury. The course is designed for a broad group of providers, including emergency medical service paramedics, nurses, residents, fellows, primary care physicians, and physicians specializing in emergency medicine, intensive care, infectious diseases, neurology and neurosurgery. Attendees are encouraged to bring laptops or tablets to take emergency neurological life support (ENLS) online guizzes. Attendees who pass the quizzes receive an ENLS certificate from the Neurocritical Care Society.
