Robin C. Vanderpool, DrPH, is chief of the Health Communication and Informatics Research Branch in the Division of Cancer Control and Population Sciences at the National Cancer Institute (NCI). As branch chief, Dr. Vanderpool leads the development of health communication research initiatives in areas such as cancer communication surveillance, patient-centered communication, digital health, and online health information.

Dr. Vanderpool also collaborates with the NCI Office of Cancer Centers on catchment area, rural cancer control, and community outreach and engagement initiatives across NCI-designated cancer centers. Prior to joining NCI, Dr. Vanderpool was a professor in the College of Public Health at the University of Kentucky (UK) and associate director for community outreach and engagement at the UK Markey Cancer Center where she led several federally funded research projects supported by NCI and CDC. Dr. Vanderpool earned a DrPH in Health Behavior from UK; a MPH in Public Health Education from Western Kentucky University; and a BS in Psychobiology from Centre College.
