Dear Exhibitor,

On behalf of Mayo Clinic and Mayo Clinic School of Professional Development, we are pleased to announce **Neurology in Clinical Practice 2026** continuing medical education activity that is held June 25-27, 2026, at San Juan Marriott Resort & Stellaris Casino, San Juan, Puerto Rico. We expect approximately 150 attendees to participate between the live and livestream.

The Neurology in Clinical Practice conference is an annual Mayo Neurology course that brings together a multidisciplinary faculty from across our three campuses in Rochester, MN; Jacksonville, FL; and Scottsdale, AZ.
