5. What is a specific piece of advice or affirmation you have received that helped you overcome professional doubt or insecurity?
6. How have you personally overcome the "I'm just..." mentality?
7. How can you integrate "generative joy" (creating joy in others) into your daily work to sustain your commitment to continuous leadership improvement?
8. Based on this episode, what is one small change you are going to make to help improve in this area? How are you going to keep yourself accountable to that and measure your success? (Be sure to keep it simple, start small, and make it very clear).
