Casey Ann Fazer-Posorske, MPAS, PA-C, is an Assistant Professor of Oncology in the Division of Medical Oncology at Mayo Clinic in Rochester, Minnesota, with associate appointment status in Medical Oncology. She serves as the Head and Neck Advanced Practice Provider (APP) Lead and Co-Tumor Chair, Program Director of the Mayo Clinic NP/PA Medical Oncology Fellowship, and Education Lead for Medical Oncology APPs. Her clinical practice focuses on head and neck cancers, with particular expertise in survivorship, immunotherapy toxicity, and multidisciplinary cancer care.

Casey has worked in head and neck cancer throughout her entire career over the past decade and spearheaded the development of the APP-led Head and Neck Cancer Survivorship Clinic at Mayo Clinic, creating a multidisciplinary model focused on comprehensive survivorship care for patients following treatment.

Her commitment to oncology education extends across Mayo Clinic and national organizations. She serves on the Mayo Clinic NP/PA Enterprise Education Committee and has held leadership roles within the Advanced Practitioner Society for Hematology and Oncology (APSHO), including Chair of the Membership Committee and service on the Education Committee.

Casey is also deeply engaged in global oncology education and workforce development. She serves on the Mayo Clinic Global Health Board and the Board of the Foundation for Cancer Care Tanzania and is a Co-Course Director for the Global Bridges Oncology Nursing Seminar (GBONS). Through GBONS, she leads sustainable educational partnerships with oncology professionals in Ghana, Kenya, Tanzania, and Vietnam through longitudinal virtual education and international hands-on training.

She has authored peer-reviewed publications and book chapters on head and neck oncology, immunotherapy toxicity, survivorship, and global oncology education and is an invited speaker at national and international oncology conferences. Her work is dedicated to advancing high-quality cancer care through education, collaboration, mentorship, and innovation.
