Dr. Khera currently serves as Vice-Chief of the Primary Care Institute for the Florida Market at Cleveland Clinic and President of Cleveland Clinic Florida Integrated Health, where he oversees primary care across the state. Since joining Cleveland Clinic in July 2022, he has led a large-scale transformation of primary care and population health, improving new-patient access by over 75%, recruiting well over 100 physicians and advanced practice providers, reducing clinician turnover to an all-time multi-year low, establishing the institute as the most productive within Cleveland Clinic Florida, building multiple innovative models of care and moving the ACO to its first shared saving.

Previously, Dr. Khera served as Chair of Medicine and Chief Population Health Officer at RWJBarnabas Health in New Jersey, and as Vice President of Medical Affairs, Chief Medical Officer, and Chief Quality Officer at Saint Francis Hospital and Medical Center / Trinity Health New England. At Saint Francis, a 650-bed tertiary academic medical center, he led the organization through its High Reliability Organization (HRO) journey, achieving multiple Leapfrog “A” ratings and positioning the system among the top hospitals in Connecticut for safety, quality, and patient experience.

He holds a master’s degree in healthcare quality and Patient Safety from Jefferson, a certificate in patient safety from VCU, a Certificate in Healthcare Artificial Intelligence from MIT, a certificate in patient experience from Beryl Institute and a certificate in Buddhist Thoughts from Harvard. He has multiple awards for excellence in teaching and was the recipient of Jefferson’s Alumni of the Year for 2025.
